Due to the lack of Stewards at my local garage, and the increasing number of new hires, I have decided to become a steward to serve as a presence in the workplace for Local 2201



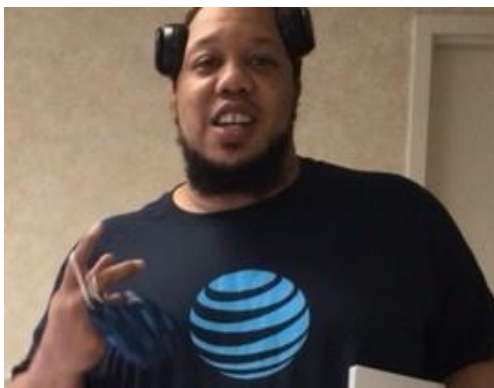
Elyse Campbell
